



SKELETAL METASTASES COMMITTEE MEMBER-AT-LARGE

Term:

The Member-at-Large serves a three (3) year term to begin and expire at the close of the Society's Annual Meeting.

Qualifications:

The Member-at-Large must be an Active, Associate or Candidate MSTS member in good standing.

Committee Responsibilities:

1. Participates in conference calls or committee meetings as needed.
2. Execute the recommendations developed by the MSTS Metastatic Disease Task Force.
3. In collaboration with other MSTS committees, develop materials, conduct workshops and other initiatives to educate MSTS members and other providers on appropriate referral, evaluation, and treatment of skeletal metastases.
4. In collaboration with other MSTS committees, seek funding and promote research on skeletal metastases.
5. In collaboration with other MSTS committees, review existing literature to guide practitioners on evidence-based treatment of skeletal metastases.
6. In collaboration with other MSTS committees, ensure that orthopedic oncology fellows receive appropriate training on the evaluation and treatment of skeletal metastases.
7. Identify racial and other disparities in the care of patients with skeletal metastases and promote equitable care.
8. Collaborate with other medical and surgical organizations to improve care and promote investigation of skeletal metastases.

Appointment:

Must complete the MSTS volunteer application. Applications are reviewed and selected by the Executive Committee for appointments.
